Welcome to our New Strategic Plan

On behalf of the Pickering Public Library Board and Leadership Team, welcome to our new Strategic Plan.

Pickering Public Library looks forward to updating its Strategic Plan every four years to meet the changing needs of the community. The process involves extensive consultation with Pickering residents to hear what is important, so that we can work together to enhance existing services or introduce new initiatives to better serve the community. When we build a Strategic Plan, we look to the local community to identify the outcomes residents care about. This guides how we allocate resources and set bold and ambitious goals.

In this Strategic Plan you will find priorities and goals that may feel both familiar to the mandate of a public library we heard loud and clear from the community that you still want books and quiet spaces—but also represent new frontiers and emerging needs, like building space for respectful community connections, combatting misinformation, and promoting play in public spaces.

The current Strategic Plan covers the period of 2024 to 2027. Each year, we will share updates with the community on our progress towards the priorities and goals outlined in this document to ensure we remain accountable to Pickering residents and stakeholders. This report will share how we are progressing towards the vision laid out in the plan and ensure that we remain accountable to you, our community.

As we implement this new Strategic Plan together, we want to highlight keywords in the vision: ideas, community, possibilities, and futures. These are powerful words we are excited to bring to life, as we strive towards being a place where everyone comes together to discover, learn, play, and connect.



Land Acknowledgement and Commitment

→ Land Acknowledgement

Pickering Public Library acknowledges the City of Pickering resides on land within the Treaty and traditional territory of the Mississaugas of Scugog Island First Nation and Williams Treaties signatories of the Mississauga and Chippewa Nations. Pickering is also home to many Indigenous persons and communities who represent other diverse, distinct, and autonomous Indigenous nations. This acknowledgment reminds us of our responsibilities to our relationships with the First Peoples of Canada, and to the ancestral lands on which we learn, share, work, and live.

This land acknowledgment was created in 2020 by the City of Pickering's Cultural Advisory Committee in collaboration with Indigenous community members from across southern Ontario.

In developing this Strategic Plan, we recognize that reconciliation and justice are not the same as achieving equity; Indigenous Peoples are not seeking equity but rather seeking to have their distinct Indigenous and Treaty Rights recognized and protected.

We are committed to an ongoing response to Truth and Reconciliation. As part of our strategic planning process, our consulting team included Ridge Road Training & Consulting who engage Indigenous community members. As a result, one specific goal identified by Indigenous residents was to celebrate Indigenous cultures and learn from Indigenous communities as a commitment to Reconciliation.

Responding to a Changing City



It's an exciting time for Pickering and the Pickering Public Library (PPL). We live in a rapidly growing and changing city, with ambitious plans for the future. But our city faces challenges too, from the rising cost of living, to growing inequality and shortfalls in our social fabric. Though we are increasingly hyper-connected, many people are feeling more isolated than ever before, and divisions are widening.

Public libraries play an important role in addressing these challenges. Libraries have increasingly become more than a collection of books or quiet spaces; they are often at the forefront of change, and play a crucial role in supporting community wellbeing during periods of transition. Libraries not only provide access to information, technology, resources but also address complex community matters like literacy, mental health, and social isolation.

We hear loud and clear, the community wants PPL to be a space where we can all imagine, nourish, and build a future for Pickering where there is room for everyone to grow and thrive. This new Strategic Plan will guide our path forward over the next four years.

In 2023, the City of Pickering developed its first Corporate Strategic Plan. The plan acts as a blueprint for our growing city for 2024-2027. It focuses on building an inclusive, connected, and healthy community, and a city that is innovative, resilient, and sustainable. The Library's Strategic Plan has been developed to ensure opportunities for alignment with the priorities of the City of Pickering.

Listening to Community

A Strategic Plan defines an organization's direction and outlines concrete actions to achieve its goals. It acts as a roadmap for an organization to implement change and new ideas. We knew that we couldn't create a new Strategic Plan for PPL without you, the public and our valued community.

We prioritized equity, invited people into the process, and made sure the Strategic Plan was reflective of what we heard and learned from the diverse community responses gathered, as well as our staff and stakeholders.


Appreciation

Strategic Plan Advisory Committee (SPAC)

We worked collaboratively with the Strategic Plan Advisory Committee (SPAC) to create the Strategic Plan. The SPAC included 15 community members, selected through an adapted civic lottery process.

Civic lotteries are equitable, inclusive, and democratic methods to randomly select participants to represent their communities, based on demographics. We adapted the selection criteria to account for historical inequities and future populations.

This process ensures that randomly selected members represent the demographically diverse makeup of Pickering as well as reflect equity-deserving populations, perspectives, and experiences. This innovative method helped centre equity and anti-oppression in the consultation process and lower barriers to participation for our community.

What We Heard



The community highlighted the Library's important role in nurturing curiosity and fostering enjoyable learning experiences for all. We heard appreciation and a continued desire for diversity within our collections, hands-on learning, and technology skill development opportunities.

Through the survey, 60% of the respondents indicated the library's purpose should be to support individuals' learning. Other top priorities included developing individuals' technology skills, providing access to new technologies, and enhancing reading and literacy in the community.

What We Heard



We heard that while PPL has made incredible strides in creating an inclusive space that is loved by many, there is more work to be done. We heard a huge desire for the library to play a role in creating cross-cultural understanding, and a space for self-expression and community wellbeing. There was also an emphasis placed on spaces and programs that cater to youth.

Residents raised challenges with accessing library services due to geographic or transportation barriers, and shared many ideas about how to create a more vibrant space that has something for everyone. Indigenous community members expressed the need for more designated Indigenous learning spaces and programs and saw the library as a cultural connector.

What Success Looks Like

- Clients report they enjoy spending time at a Pickering Public Library location.
- Clients see themselves reflected in our spaces, whether through enhanced collections, local history, or public and community art displays.
- Library spaces are refreshed to create spaces that support client activities.





What We Heard



We heard about rising social challenges and polarization and the need for the library as a trusted, democratic, and safe public space. We also heard an excitement for the future of this growing city, and a desire to work collaboratively in creating communities within the City that lifts all Pickering residents up.

Residents shared their view that a public library could be a forum for community conversations, where residents can talk about issues, solutions and how to feel more connected to their neighbours.

What Success Looks Like

- Clients feel that the Library supports opportunities for residents to advocate for their shared needs and fully participate in civic life in Pickering.
- Clients and staff understand why intellectual freedom is a core tenet of public libraries.
- Clients report that the Library is a place they might run into their neighbours or engage someone new in a conversation and staff are trained to facilitate community conversations.
- Residents of Pickering understand the range of services the Library offers.



PPL should be a one-stop shop for "information", an information hub, a self-learning environment, and a structured space that is protected but free to think and just be.

Creating a library system that is prepared for the impacts of a changing climate, resilient to a quickly growing city, and innovative in its approach to meeting community needs was brought forward throughout the engagement.

We also heard excitement about opportunities for the community to continue to provide input into shaping PPL, with opportunities to share and be heard and understand how feedback is applied.

Staff have the training, skills, and support to deliver emerging technology services and iterate to continuously improve service delivery.


